- SPAN 3300 must be taken at UVa or through a recommended study abroad program. It must be completed before continuing to survey or literature courses.
- Completing one survey course is a prerequisite for taking any 4000-level literature or culture course. Ideally a major will take both surveys before advancing to a 4000 -level course in literature or culture.
- Fourth-year majors may not take a survey course; they must substitute a 4000-level literature course instead. The substitute course must be in the same area as the survey being replaced (e.g. a Latin American literature course for a Latin American literature survey or a Spanish literature course for a Spanish literature survey).
- AP Language exam: Students with a score of 4 should proceed to 3010 . Students with a score of 5 place out of 3010 and may not take it for credit; they may proceed to any of the following: SPAN 3000, 3020, 3030, 3031, 3032, 3040, 3200 or 3300.
- AP Literature exam: Students with a score of 4 should proceed to 3300 . Students with a score of 5 place out of 3010 and 3300 and may not take either for credit; they may take any SPAN course at the 3000 level, EXCEPT 3010 and 3300 . Students who are placed out of SPAN 3300 must still earn 30 credits of upper-division Spanish to complete the major, substituting another literature course for SPAN 3300.
- Only one conversation course can count toward the major. Conversation classes are closed to native speakers.
- Course exceptions must be approved by the student's Major Advisor AND the Director of Undergraduate Programs.
